Belgium	Open to one household	N/A	Vessels are permitted alongside. Special arrival requirements depend on the terminal. Some require a statement from the Master about health of all crew members. If crew are not EU citizen/resident, no crew change is allowed. Crew can go ashore but are not allowed to be with more than 2 persons at a time. 3 persons is a group and
Croatia	Open to EU citizens	No	Croatia is open to foreign yacht owners, crew members, and charter guests (for yachts over 24m) with no quarantine needed. Guests can arrive: they do not need to have fresh Anti Covid test but it is recommended for crew safety. Guests will need to have proof that they own the yachts in Croatia. Ship registry is ok if the yacht is under the name and surname. If the yacht is under a company name, customs will need the connection between the company and the private person. For yacht guests, the invitation from the owner will be needed. There is no limitation of number of guests, so if they yacht can take 12 guests, it is possible. Guests will need to follow social distancing and anti-COVID recommendations that are in place. Need to show proof of charter. Only ban is for cruise ships with 40+ passengers.
Cyprus	Open	Depending on provenance (see notes)	Able to accept international arrivals but currently all crew/passengers must remain onboard under quarantine. From 'non-approved' countries, expecting that a control measure will remain which is believed to be a 14-day quarantine, a requirement to present a recent (just before departure) negative covid-19 test, or for a test to be taken upon arrival with disembarkation allowed after receipt of a negative result. Accepting arrivals as of June 9th from limited countries As of June 19 the the list will be expanded to include more countries. The virus test is still in place but we can do it upon arrival, and no crew to go ashore until results are in. Results take Abt one day depending on arrival times
Denmark	Open	See notes	All crew must be on board – no shore leave is allowed. Vessels are permitted alongside. Requirements are SafeSeaNet and Marime Health Declaration More information about opening up is expected on the 1st of June. Crew change is still possible however, all inbound and outbound personnel needs to carry a document stating their purpose of transit – this can be a letter from the employer or we can issue a Letter of guarantee. The on signers are allowed to stay overnight in Denmark but the flights needs to be as close as possible to the vessel's ETA. The off signers are allowed to stay overnight in Denmark until the first flight out of the country is available. No quarantine is allowed at the moment. All crew must carry valid LOG and be in transit, no overnight stay.

Egypt	Open	If infected, yes	<p>No transit restrictions unless ship size and draft.</p> <p>The following documents to be sent in advance 4 days prior any vessel arrival to transit Suez Canal as requested by Quarantine Authority:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • International Maritime Declaration of Health. • Last 10 Ports of Call List • Vaccination List • Crew List • Medical Chest Certificate. <p>Master to declare any suspected infection and infected members to be isolated/locked.</p> <p>Quarantine will attend to inspect if any suspected infection.</p> <p>In case found positive infection, Quarantine instruction will be followed.</p>
Estonia	Open to EU citizens	Depending on country of origin	<p>The borders of Estonia are reopened from 01/06 to travellers arriving from European countries. Estonia will admit people with no symptoms arriving from the European Union, the members of the Schengen area or the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.</p> <p>The compulsory quarantine for people arriving in Estonia depends on whether the relative coronavirus infection rate in their country of origin is above 15. This means that no more than 15 people per 100 000 inhabitants are infected in the passenger's country of origin in the past 14 days. Anyone arriving in Estonia from a country with a higher infection rate must self-isolate for two weeks on arrival.</p>
Finland	Open to EU citizens	N/A	<p>Borders are closed for tourism and only residents are allowed to enter the country. Since 13/05 some limitation are lifted for travel between Finland and Sweden, Finland and Estonia but only for travel for work and professional needs. Anticipating updates concerning yachts/pleasure craft from the Finnish Border Guard this week.</p>
France	Open to EU citizens	No if from EU, Schengen or UK	<p>Crew change is possible for Schengen nationalities.</p> <p>No need for any decalrations, just documentation of the boat.</p>
Germany	Open to EU citizens	No unless symptoms or proximity to COVID-19 suspects	<p>Vsl's have to answer a questionnaire with respect to any Corona suspect onboard vsl.</p> <p>Not mandatory arrival requirements set in force yet but recommended all crew to stay on board and not to go ashore.</p> <p>Crew member have to complete a port health data sheet confirming not having visited any of the high risk areas within the last 30 days, confirming not being in contact with any corona suspects , not suffering from several symptoms such as cough, fever etc.</p> <p>Non EU/Schengen Citizens presently can not enter the country for a period of 30 days.</p> <p>Flights from Turkey to Germany are restricted</p> <p>Presently almost 80% off all flights are cancelled.</p> <p>Any crew subject to isolation period will not be allowed ashore but has to stay onboard.</p>
Gibraltar	Open	None if no potential risk	<p>No restrictions on yacht charter.Vessels must complete 2 health documents to be submitted prior to arrival.</p> <p>Then, the Gibraltar Port Authority will decide if any additional measures are needed. There will be quarantine issues (14 days) when boats can enter Greek ports.</p> <p>No more than 4 crew members should be out together at the same time - only for necessities. Recommend to have their crew ID, no need for COVID 19 form</p> <p>Crew changes allowed subject to restrictions.</p> <p>No restrictions in relation to vessel activities, the restrictions are only applicable to crew chnages.</p> <p>No restrictions on vessels port calling alongside.</p>

Greece	Open to EU citizens	14 days	<p>Declaration of Health on daily basis and 48/24 hrs prior arrival. 48 hrs prior arrival to be sent IMO crew list with the date and place of embarkation of the entire crew members.</p> <p>Crew is prohibited to go ashore.</p> <p>Restrictions depend on port, crew changes are allowed only for EU/Schengen countries crew. They must fly the same day of disembarkation/embarkation. E-Ticket with final destination crew's country is required, as per immigration regulations. They cannot be accommodated in hotel.</p> <p>Quarantine 14 days all citizens' relatives arriving from other countries.</p> <p>No flights to/from Greece are taking place.</p> <p>Some air-freight movements allowed with priority to medicine/medical equipment.</p>
Iceland	Open	No	<p>Crew change is possible for Schengen nationalities.</p> <p>No need for any declarations, just documentation of the boat.</p>
Italy	Open to EU citizens	No	<p>Private boat with eu or UK or Schengen area guests onboard are allowed to cruise along Italy.</p> <p>Commercial boat not admitted, chartering not admitted as well as extra Schengen guests re not allowed to cruise.. this restriction will be over on 15/06 when external Schengen people will be admitted into Italy.. but need to be confirmed</p>
Latvia & Lithuania	Open to EU citizens	Depending on country of origin	<p>Restrictions to enter the country are lifted for travellers arriving for EU, Schengen Area Countries and UK and Ireland. 14 days self isolation is required for persons arriving from countries where relative coronavirus infection rate is above 15.</p> <p>In Lithuania restrictions have been lifted for citizens and lawful residents of the countries of the European Economic Area, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom, who arrive from one of these countries, provided the incidence of COVID-19 in the country where they lawfully reside was less than 15 cases/100 000 population in the last 14 days</p> <p>The current "safe list" of countries: Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, and Switzerland.</p> <p>Travellers coming from Spain, Ireland, Malta and can enter Lithuania, but will be subject to a 14-day self-isolation period.</p> <p>Travel is still prohibited from Belgium, Sweden, Portugal, and the UK, where the number of COVID-19 incidents exceeds 25 cases/100,000 population.</p>
Malta	Open if exempt	Quarantine on a case by case	<p>An exemption has been issued since the 5th of June, with regards to transit yachts with only crew on board, from outside Malta, with the objective of berthing in Maltese ports for the purpose of refuelling, flagging, customs procedure and other ancillary necessities.</p>
Monaco	Open to EU citizens	No	<p>Boats can come in and out with clearance procedures and health declarations</p>

Montenegro	Open to EU citizens	Yes	<p>Any yacht size (with crew and guests) are allowed to enter Montenegro with 14 days of quarantine period to stay in special berths in marina.</p> <p>Here are the procedures for embarcation of foreign seaman in Montenegro:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Formal request to his/her diplomatic representative for Montenegro with explanation and statement of purpose for arrival in Montenegro; 2. Diplomatic entity will forward and coordinate request to the Montenegrin Ministry of Foreign Affairs where they will process it and send it for approval to the National Coordination Service in Montenegro who should approve it since Montenegrin seamen are allowed to embark their vessels all over the world due to Convention for free transit of seamen; 3. After that formal document is issued and delivered to the Diplomatic representative who will deliver it to the person who requested it and inform him/her about possible ways of traveling to Montenegro. <p>Special announce for approval must be maid trough local agent at least 24hrs prior to arrival.</p>
Norway	Open	Yes, if infected	<p>No shore leave. Information regarding Covid-19: Embarking and disembarking crew/ Shore leave in South Western Police district .</p> <p>The Police authority will allow crew to leave the vessel to execute necessary operations regarding loading/unloading and other tasks necessary to attend the ship`s operation and safety, as well as safeguarding the country`s supply lines.</p> <p>Work related to international sailings has to be within the ports ISPS area, and as close to the vessel as possible while necessary operations can be executed.</p> <p>Work related to domestic itineraries with foreign crew, or sailings including foreign ports within the last 14 days, has to be executed in close vicinity to the ship.</p> <p>No physical contact between the crew and employees in the port areas is allowed. Port employees are not allowed on board the ship without permission from the Police.</p> <p>Vessel Captain must confirm: That there</p> <p>is no known, or suspected outbreak of COVID-19 onboard your vessel</p> <p>That the vessel during the past 14 days has not visited a port within an area with widespread transmission of Covid-19</p> <p>No knowledge of any person onboard who, during the past 14 days, has been in an area of widespread transmission of COVID-19</p> <p>Crew to sign on/off still need approval case by case basis. Crew must be transported directly to / from arrival / departure airport in Norway.</p> <p>In effect, no domestic flights for offsigning crew, and no domestic flights for onsigning crew coming from abroad.</p> <p>Hotels to be avoided, but if no other choice we must find designated quarantine hotel and place crew there.</p>
Poland	Open depending on marinas	No	No quarantine on Mazurian Lakes District. Most marinas are open. Charters allowed.
Portugal	Open to EU citizens/residents	14 days	<p>Vessels are permitted to enter the Azores islands for bunkering, refueling, supply of provions, stores and supply of fresh water.</p> <p>Calls permitted for provisions, bunkers, discharge/load.</p> <p>Crew changes permitted on a case by case basis. Anyone arriving to Portugal must carry out 14 day quarantine period.</p> <p>Normal pre-arrival requirements.</p>

Romania	Depending on port (see notes)	Depending on crew health, see notes	<p>There are not any restrictions regarding berthing of super-yachts in Constanta Port.</p> <p>All ships arriving within 14 days after departure from any risk area are allowed to proceed alongside berth where the sanitary authorities will check crew and passengers clinically and thermometrically. If all crew/passengers are found healthy then free pratique is granted. Direct contact between the crew/passengers and the shore personnel is limited and only after all precautionary health measures are taken including protective filter masks, gloves and clothing;</p> <p>Crew changes are allowed basis specific restrictions (details can be provided if needed). Ships arriving after the 14 day period and if their crew are healthy are not subject to any restrictions.</p> <p>In case of any ship arriving with suspected cases of Covid-19 on board, then vessel shall be put in isolation (probably at outer roads) and no cargo operations will be performed.</p>
Russia	Open (see notes)	14 days	<p>Any yacht entering Russia must go through disinfection and quarantine after clearance. As from 23rd, it is allowed to freely move inside the city.</p> <p>For foreign citizens (any country except Russia), vessels will have to stay in Customs control zone until restrictions are lifted.</p>
Spain	Open to EU citizens	Yes except crew	<p>No restrictions for vessels calling alongside. However, assistance on board of shore personnel (terminal rep, agent, surveyor) will be avoided as much as possible. Some terminals have their own procedures, that will be advised by agent, but the measures are similar to avoid direct contact.</p> <p>Vessel to confirm there is no crew with any Covid-19 symptoms prior arrival. Usually sending Maritime Health Declaration. For On/Off non-Schengen citizens that require visa issuing, itinerary must be accepted by immigration to carry out the crew change, if not they may be stopped at the borders. Crew members (Both on/off) must hold with them at every moment the following docs to show police in case taxi is stopped at any road control (Seamans book, Visa when needed). Employment agreement or letter of appointment issued by owner or agency of the crew or Master. Must be included the following info: vessel name & imo number & flag, Port for crew change, full details of crew change (date of embarking - estimate, date of disembarking - estimate). Crew change is permitted, with restrictions. Flights are very restricted, as only few airports are open to passengers' movement. Hotels are closed except some hotels that are open at each Spanish region for essential workers stay (Crew is included), availability to be confirmed. Crew must always follow hotel COVID19 guidelines. No quarantine period for crew. For offsigners - arrival crew list signed and stamped by Master. No restriction on nationality. For On/Off non-Schengen citizens that require visa issuing, itinerary must be accepted by immigration to carry out the crew change, if not they may be stopped at the borders. Flights/hotels are very restricted. Restrictions on non-essential movement (ie except food shopping, medical care). Crew only allowed to go directly from airport to (Can be hotel on above exceptions) vessel & viceversa. Sweden	Open to EU citizens	No	<p>Regarding access to Swedish waters, port calls and going ashore in Sweden all is open for EU citizens. Non EU citizens are able to call Swedish ports but are not allowed to go ashore if not crew and should sign off (we need to seek permission from Immigration, emergency visa in that case)</p> <p>All vessels can call Swedish ports, but only EU citizens can go ashore.</p> <p>Crew is only permitted ashore for vessel specific work like discharging trash etc. in many ports.</p> <p>Pre-arrival requirements: Health declaration to be presented min 24 hrs prior to arrival.</p> <p>No crew restrictions.</p> <p>Crew traveling have to be able to present LOG and travel arrangements/tickets in addition to seamans book and passport. The Netherlands	Open to EU citizens	No	<p>Maritime Declaration of Health to be updated to Port Authorities every 24 hours.</p> <p>Vessels are permitted alongside, no special requirements.</p> <p>Crew to be split over more taxi's.</p> <p>4 person taxi: max 2 persons</p> <p>8 person taxi: max 4 persons</p> <p>All off-shore terminals still allow boarding through terminal, but other terminals don't allow any more, so expect same to happen within the next few days for all terminals.</p> <p>EU citizens are allowed to travel at any time and can stay at a hotel awaiting vessels arrival or wait at a hotel until their flight is available.</p> <p>Non-EU citizens: of course, those countries who should have a Schengen-visa require a visa when passing borders.</p> <p>The immigration prefers they take the shortest route from the airport to the vessel or the other way around.</p> <p>Immigration also realizes that this is not always possible, in these cases when for example</p>

UAE	Case by case	Awaiting information	<p>To enhance the effectiveness of the National Screening Programme and reduce the spread of COVID-19, movement between regions within Abu Dhabi (Abu Dhabi, Al Ain and Al Dhafrah), as well as in and out of Abu Dhabi emirate, is banned starting from tomorrow, Tuesday 1 June, for a period of one week.</p> <p>This ban includes all residents, including UAE Nationals.</p> <p>Exemptions are available by special permit for employees of vital sectors, chronic disease patients visiting hospitals and the transportation of necessary goods.</p> <p>Residents in each region are allowed to move within their region in line with National Sterilisation Programme timings.</p> <p>This ban may cause delays in the transfer of individuals, documents, parcels, etc between Ruwais/Jebel Dhanna and Abu Dhabi city.</p>
Ukraine	Awaiting information	See notes	<p>Currently, quarantine is effect in Ukraine and all restrictions are in accordance with quarantine regulations.</p> <p>Requirements for vessels calling at Ukrainian ports are:</p> <p>Crew members will be checked on arrival by sanitary authorities</p> <p>Crew members' shore leave suspended until further notice</p> <p>Crew change for foreign citizens suspended until further notice</p> <p>All international flights and international passenger transport have been suspended until further notice.</p>
United Kingdom	Open	Awaiting information.	All arrivals to the UK from overseas will be required to complete an online form giving contact addresses and travel history before arriving. This form is not currently available. Meanwhile, the UK government's information on new travel restrictions and exemptions confirm that seafarers are exempted. You can find more details on the Coronavirus tab via the GAC GROUP website.

United States	Depending on state		<p>American Airlines will resume some service to the Caribbean islands from June 4th.</p> <p>Pre-arrival requirements: Health declaration to be presented min 24 hrs prior to arrival</p> <p>The French Caribbean islands, St Barths, St. Martin, Guadeloupe, Martinique and Saba have started the reopening process.</p> <p>Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis has agreed to let Palm Beach County begin its reopening starting on Monday. That means restaurants can open to 25% capacity plus outside seating, and hair salons and other personal care businesses can reopen using distancing guidelines and protective measures. Bars, gyms and beaches remain closed.</p> <p>Broward County, which includes Fort Lauderdale, and Miami-Dade County remain closed down except for essential businesses. In the press conference yesterday, Gov. DeSantis said they might begin reopening by May 18.</p> <p>Palm Beach County beaches likely will reopen on May 18, county Mayor Dave Kerner said during the press conference.</p> <p>CBP Boston temporarily closes small boat reporting locations</p> <p>U.S. Customs and Border Protection's field office in Boston has temporarily closed small boat reporting locations throughout New England. According to a CBP statement, "We are assisting the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in implementing [its] authority under Title 42, U.S. Code 265, in accordance with existing Title 8 authority and prohibiting the entry of certain persons into the United States."</p> <p>The CBP statement was released April 27. On April 22, U.S. President Donald Trump signed an executive order that bars some immigration into the United States for 60 days.</p> <p>According to the CBP Boston field office, "Effective immediately, small boating locations are temporarily closed for all CBP private vessel processing, including the use of ROAM until further notice." The statement also "reminds travelers that routine private vessel travel for pleasure is non-essential."</p>
Seychelles	Closed depending on provenance (see notes)	N/A	<p>As of 10 March 2020, all cruise ships are not allowed entry into Seychelles waters until further notice.</p> <p>Any marine vessel will not be allowed to enter Seychelles waters if any passenger or crew on board has been to China, South Korea, Italy and Iran in the last 14 days.</p>

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
